DUAL CREDIT

Dual Credit opportunities allow students to get a head start on their future by exploring areas of interest in high school. Students are able to enroll in post-secondary courses, earning both high school and post-secondary credits at the same time. Courses will be offered in the areas of Veterinary/Animal Sciences, Health Fields & Nursing, Psychology, Aviation, Police Studies, Business, Sciences, Administration, Accounting, Early Learning and Information Technology.

Each of these courses/programs can be a stepping stone to exciting careers in multiple areas. Students in Edmonton Catholic Schools will be able to explore their passions and interests within their own high school environment.

PASS

PASS is an Alternative Education high school after hours program for students who want a self-paced, individualized approach to their education. Courses are offered in modules (self-paced resources) broken up into smaller units to be completed independently (asynchronously) with the help of a certified teacher.

The teacher and the student determine appropriate goals and can set personalized schedules.

*** All assessments are in person.

The program currently operates from four ECSD locations and is available from September to June, every Monday and Wednesday from 4:00 PM - 7:00 PM.



SECOND LANGUAGE COURSE CHALLENGE

Current ECSD high school students have the opportunity to demonstrate proficiency (culture, speaking, reading, writing) in one of six languages Filipino, French, Italian, Polish, Spanish and Ukrainian.

WORK EXPERIENCE & RAP (REGISTERED APPRECENTICESHIP PROGRAM)

The School of Alternative Education in partnership with ECSD High Schools offer an off-campus experience to support students interested in Work Experience and/or the Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP).

The School of Alternative Education is committed to supporting ECSD High School students that qualify for one of these programs. If the school Principal approves student participation in these programs and the student requires the program for high school completion, post-secondary, or career aspirations, the School of Alternative Education will also support the request.

REGISTERED APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM (RAP)

RAP students are both full-time students and registered apprentices, dividing their time between an approved work site and their high school studies. They take regular courses such as English Language Arts, Social Studies, Science and Math in order to earn their Alberta High School Diploma or Certificate of Achievement.

The time a RAP student spends at school and on the work site can be quite flexible. The student, school and employer jointly agree on a suitable schedule. The student might work as a RAP apprentice for a semester, for half of each school day, or for one or two days per week, or during summers, holidays and weekends. The RAP apprenticeship ends when the RAP apprentice finishes high school.

The RAP apprentice is then automatically registered as a regular apprentice and the credit earned while in the RAP program is applied to his or her apprenticeship through the apprenticeship program.

SUMMER SCHOOL



For students requiring further instruciton, or those wishing to improve their course mark, Edmonton Catholic School of Alternative Education offers a summer school program. This program is offered in classroom-based, self paced and online delivery models.

Regular classroom-based delivery model is offered at four ECSD High Schools as well as French Immersion program offered at J.H. Picard.

All summer school sites have a structure of scheduled courses with daily instruction from a qualified ECSD teacher.

Immersed within these sites are summer school programs for our EAL Learners (English as an additional language) and Indigenous students.

Dual Credit - Summer school provides dual credit programming to high school students who are looking to earn post-secondary and high school credits simultaneously while attending high school.

The classroom-based, self paced and online delivery modules have full day classes, fives days per week for approximately four weeks in July and offer many core subjects and complimentary subjects.

- All assessments are in person for all delivery methods. Accommodations will not be made for holidays or missed exams/assessments
- Accepting all ECSD students under 20 years of age as of September 1, of the current school year.
- Current Grade 9 students, who are entering Grade 10, may only register for 3 credit courses.
- English 30-1 and Social 30-1 are not offered through self-paced delivery.
- Not all courses are being offered at each location. Courses offered can be viewed by logging into your Alternative Education Online Registration Account.

CLASSROOM-BASED DELIVERY METHOD AND LOCATIONS

Offers a traditional approach to learning within a classroom environment. Learn with direct instruction from an Edmonton Catholic School Division teacher using a wide range of instructional methods.

*One 3 credit or one 5 credit course is a maximum course load for classroombased summer school.

SELF-PACED DELIVERY METHOD AND LOCATIONS

Offers instruction for self-motivated students within a module-based learning environment. Students can access one-on-one support from curriculum specialized Edmonton Catholic School Division teachers.

*Two 3 credit or one 5 credit course is a maximum course load for self-paced summer school.

Religion students must complete 10 community service hours.

Assessment:

All exams/assessments are in person.

Note: Self-paced CALM and Religion courses do not have in-person assessments. Students should be available to pick up and drop off modules and meet with their teacher as required.

ONLINE DELIVERY METHOD AND LOCATION

Offers a unique approach to online learning in that students can participate in an *asynchronous classroom environment supported by Edmonton Catholic School Division teachers.

*Asynchronous learning allows students to access all material needed for the course at any time so students can work at their own pace to complete in the given timeline. Should students have questions, the teacher will be available for support (via Teams, email, or in-person) during the hours of 8:30 a.m. - 2:00 p.m.
