Course Overview Students will explore the origins and complexities of ideologies and examine multiple perspectives regarding the principles of classical and modern liberalism. An analysis of various political and economic systems will allow students to assess the viability of the principles of liberalism. Developing understandings of the roles and responsibilities associated with citizenship will encourage students to respond to emergent global issues.	
Key Issue	Key Outcome
To what extent should we embrace an ideology?	Students will understand, assess and respond to the complexities of ideologies.
Related Issues	General Outcomes
1. To what extent should ideology be the foundation of identity?	Students will explore the relationship between identity and ideology.
2. To what extent is resistance to liberalism justified?	Students will assess impacts of, and reactions to, principles of liberalism.
3. To what extent are the principles of liberalism viable?	Students will assess the extent to which the principles of liberalism are viable in a contemporary world.
4. To what extent should my actions as a citizen be shaped by an ideology?	Students will assess their rights, roles and responsibilities as citizens.
Assessment	The student's grade will be calculated based on the following: Course Weightings Major Assessments - 35% Assignments - 20% Quizzes - 25% Final Summative Assessment - 20% *Final Grade: 70% of the school grade will be combined with 30% of the diploma exam grade to calculate an overall final grade Alternative Education does not publish report cards.
