Course Overview Math 20-2 consists of 6 units of study, as outlined below. The student's <u>school-based</u> mark is weighted as follows:	
Units & Topics of Study	Weighting
Unit 1: Radicals Solve problems that involve operations on radicals and radical expressions with numerical and variable radicands (limited to square roots); Solve problems that involve radical equations (limited to square roots or cube roots).	14%
Unit 2: Quadratics Demonstrate an understanding of the characteristics of quadratic functions, including vertex, intercepts, domain, and range; Solve problems that involve quadratic equations.	23%
Unit 3: Logic and Reasoning Analyze and prove conjectures, using inductive and deductive reasoning, to solve problems	12%
Unit 4: Geometry Demonstrate an understanding of the relationships among scale factors, areas, surface areas and volumes of similar 2-D shapes and 3-D objects; Solve problems that involve the cosine law and the sine law, excluding the ambiguous case.	12%
Unit 5: Proportional Reasoning Solve problems that involve scale diagrams, using proportional reasoning; Analyze puzzles and games that involve spatial reasoning, using problem-solving strategies; Solve problems that involve the application of rates.	8%
Unit 6: Statistics Demonstrate an understanding of normal distribution, including standard deviation and z-scores; Interpret statistical data, using confidence intervals, confidence levels and margin of error.	11%
Final Exam (Common Summative Assessment)	20%
